He has had consistently great trackers since the beginning of term! He is a role model to his friends.

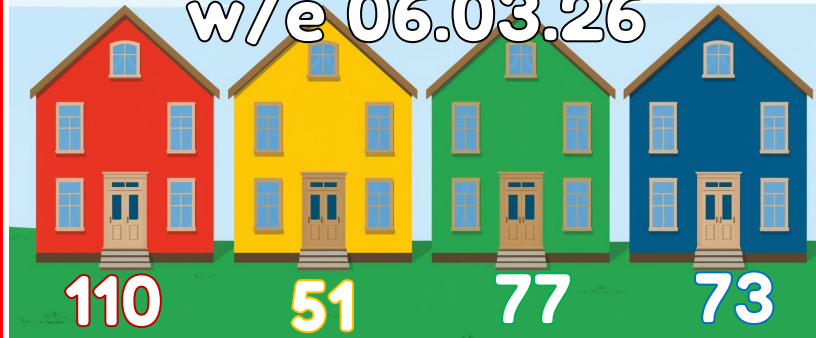

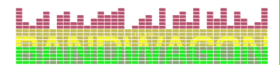

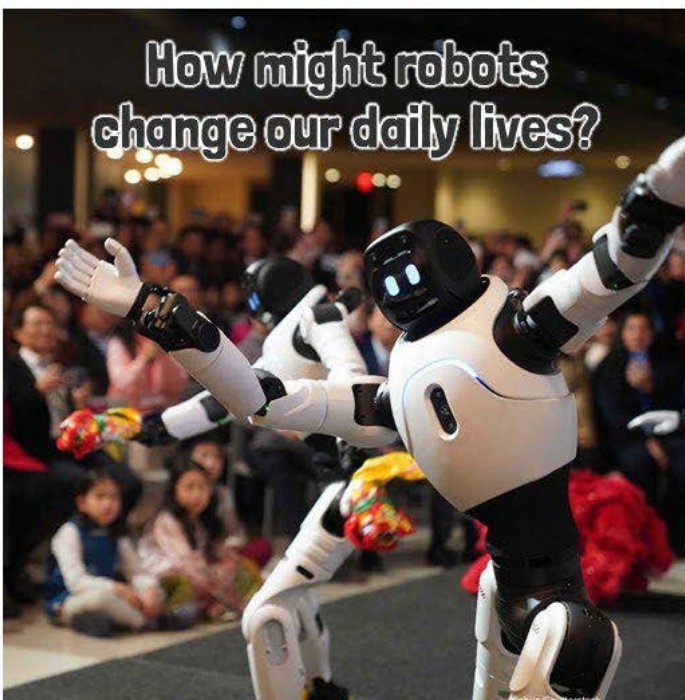
