Dutch inventor, Boyan Slat, first became worried about ocean pollution as a teenager after seeing huge amounts of plastic while diving. He created the organisation The Ocean Cleanup, which designs special systems to remove rubbish from oceans and stop more plastic entering rivers and seas.

Stars of the Week Ben, Caleb and Keiran

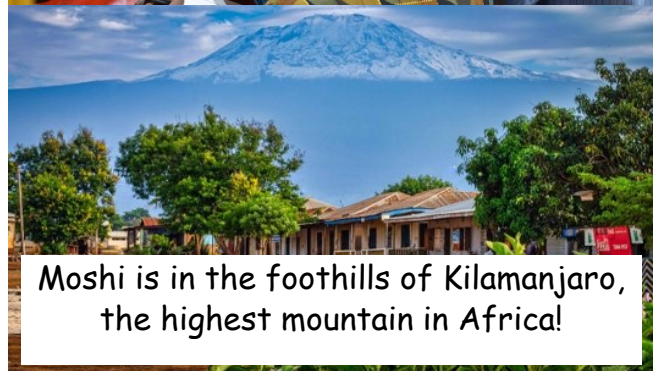
For the first time in the history of Star of the Week we have not one, not two, but **THREE** stars!

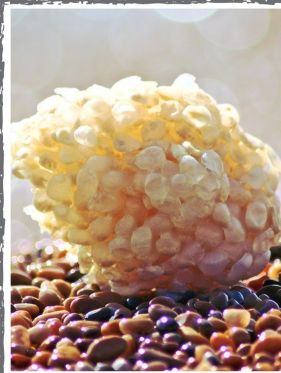

SAFER SCHOOL RUN REMEMBER



ALWAYS hold your child's hand or ensure they walk sensibly beside you. **NO** running across the driveway. School starts at 08:45. **ALWAYS** wait at the school gate for school staff to let you in when they have finished morning briefing. **DO NOT** let yourself into school. Children must be handed over to a member of school staff, to check they have everything they need for their day.

EATEN IN THE SCHOOL
VEHICLES AT ANY TIME
