Have a great weekend! Stay cool!

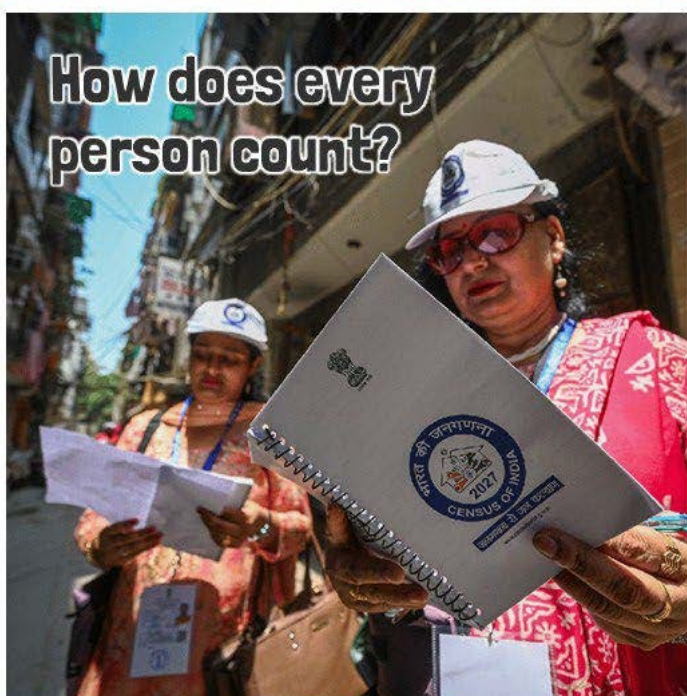
